

OLTD 501 – Reflection on my Powtoon to demonstrate understanding of the OLTD Learning Outcomes – ***Demonstrate basic competency with design and implementation with a variety of online environments and tools and Demonstrate an understanding of common terms, definitions and elements related to online learning.***

The second piece of evidence that I have chosen to demonstrate my learning and understanding is a short animation using the online platform Powtoon. I used a template from this application to create a Powtoon that provided a brief description of three of Horn and Staker’s blended learning rotation models – Station, Lab, and Individual.

I was not familiar with this platform and was hesitant to even begin. This assignment made me face my ‘fear’ around being able to seamlessly navigate around a new online tool. I was tasked with learning how to edit, copy, cut, size, and customize each frame to properly meet the expectations of the assignment.
